SPA UPDATES



New School Design Projects and Presentations

The New School Design Project aims to foster social entrepreneurship among students, offering them a platform to apply 14 months of acquired knowledge and skills in a single, complex capstone project. The initiative seeks to break away from traditional school models, encouraging the creation of innovative educational designs that equip students to tackle 21st-century challenges. Although cutting-edge in many aspects, these designs are rooted in real-world considerations like budget limitations and local cultural dynamics. Over the years, several of these projects have been implemented as real schools, and elements from these models have found their way into existing educational programs today.

At the end of the presentations, there were two awards given out to based on feedback from their peers and a panel of judges.

This year's SPA Choice Award, voted upon by the 2024 entering cohort, was bestowed on Heart Academy.

Situated in East Harlem, the school's mission was committed to nurturing students' diverse strengths, empowering them to become positive agents of change within their communities and the world. Their four year goals for each grade in the high school include the following:

9th Grade: Self

Students focus on self discovery and build self awareness

10th Grade: Local



NEW SCHOOL DESIGN

Students engage with East Harlem and other diverse communities in New York City

11th Grade: National

Students explore national issues and cultures by traveling across the United States

12th Grade: Global

Students gain a global perspective by participating in international experiential learning.

"At Heart Academy, [their vision is to] inspire every hummingbird to leverage their strengths and revitalize [their] East Harlem community.

The second accolade presented was the Best New School Design Award. This honor was bestowed upon the Legacy of Leaders School for their outstanding assembly and presentation of their school, selected by a panel of judges comprised of distinguished educators from across the country. Legacy of Leaders was located in Mount Vernon, an area where there are lower levels of educational attainment than its wealthier neighboring districts. The school's vision is for "[their] leaders [to] utilize their self awareness, self efficacy, and self-identity to honor communities where their leadership can thrive. With past wisdom as our compass, our visionaries create radical change through love." A portrait of a typical graduate from Legacy of Leaders is able to be culturally competent, proud of their identity and sense of self, embodies sankofa love, is civically engaged and innovating, and thinks beyond the bounds!
