

SPA Faculty Spotlight

DR. NANCY GUTIERREZ

"Championing Equity, Advocacy, and Leadership in Education"

Nancy Gutierrez's journey in education began deeply rooted in her community of East San Jose, California, where she began as a middle school teacher. Her early teaching experiences brought her immense joy and set the foundation for a career dedicated to transformative leadership in education. Today, she serves as the President and Lead Executive Officer (LEO) of The Leadership Academy, a nationally recognized nonprofit organization that supports school and system leaders across 41 states in disrupting systemic inequities and creating conditions for all students to thrive. Since 2003, The Leadership Academy supports school and system leaders from the schoolhouse to the statehouse, creating the rigorous and responsive classrooms we want for our own children and/or children we love. They have worked with over 436 school systems, state education departments, and organizations, impacting more than 15,000 leaders nationwide.

Before stepping into her current role at the helm of The Leadership Academy, Nancy worked with the New York City Department of Education's leadership office, where she played a pivotal role in guiding aspiring principals and superintendents. She launched a program for executive leadership advancement that led to superintendent certification and shaped the next generation of educational leaders. Nancy's leadership as the founding principal of Renaissance Academy in East San Jose—the highest-performing middle school in the district and a California Distinguished School—and her successful turnaround of the district's lowest-performing middle school earned her accolades, including the UC Davis Rising Star award and the Association of California School Administrators' Region 8 Middle School Principal of the Year in 2010.

Nancy's academic contributions extend to teaching at esteemed institutions such as New York University, Teachers College, and Harvard University. At Teachers College's Summer Principals Academy (SPA), she has taught courses including 4001: Introduction to School Leadership and Decision Making and currently co-teaches Cultural Diversity II with Dr. Janice Gassam Asare. Her teaching philosophy emphasizes the principles of adult learning, fostering growth through discomfort, storytelling, and active engagement. She views learning as an inherently social process and designs her classes to be highly interactive, ensuring students take an active role in intellectual exploration through deep, participatory discussions.



The course Nancy currently co-teaches for SPA, Cultural Diversity II, focuses on developing culturally responsive, equity-centered leaders equipped to address systemic inequities in education. This course examines harmful schooling practices, fosters critical discourse, and builds the capacity to create more equitable educational structures. Nancy's dedication to her students is at the heart of her work. She takes pride in their drive and capabilities, often leaving her classes inspired by their passion for leading schools and systems. One of Nancy's most memorable teaching moments occurred during a case study exercise when a student courageously shared personal insights tied to their identity. This act of vulnerability enriched the class's understanding and underscored the importance of proactive learning about each other's identities. For Nancy, such moments highlight the power of building networks that empower future leaders to navigate challenges while staying grounded in their purpose.



Nancy's advocacy extends beyond the classroom. Her first book, *Stay and Prevail: Students of Color Don't Need to Leave Their Communities to Succeed*, which was co-authored with Dr. Roberto Padilla, Superintendent of New York City's District 7 in the South Bronx, challenges the narrative that success requires leaving one's roots. She encourages young people, particularly students of color, to see reinvesting in their communities as a valid and fulfilling path. Her work emphasizes the importance of honoring one's heritage while navigating broader opportunities. The book has resonated widely, selling out on platforms such as Amazon and Barnes & Noble, and its success underscores the relevance of her message.



Nancy has recently co-authored a new book with her colleagues Michelle Jarney and Michael Kim titled *Coaching Education Leaders: A Culturally Responsive Approach to Transforming Schools and Systems.* This groundbreaking work, which encompasses 20+ years of coaching experience, introduces a Facilitative Competency-Based Coaching approach developed by The Leadership Academy. It provides strategies for planning the full arc of the coaching experience, real stories from the field, and practical tools for immediate application. The book emphasizes creating safe learning spaces and engaging in deep dialogues to address systemic challenges, making it an essential resource for fostering sustainable change in schools and systems.



On February 13, Nancy and her colleagues will host an interactive book talk at Teachers College to discuss their new work. This event promises to be an engaging opportunity to learn more about their innovative coaching approach and its impact on educational leadership.

Nancy Gutierrez's leadership and teaching exemplify her steadfast commitment to transformative education. By centering cultural understanding, advocacy, and community ties, she inspires her students and colleagues to envision and work toward a more inclusive and equitable future.
