# QUIERE Scholars (teachers funded through QUIERE) will...

- complete a 48-credit dual certification Masters of Arts (MA) degree at Teachers College, Columbia University about half of the degree will be funded by QUIERE (23 out of 48 credits);
- be eligible for New York initial certification in early childhood education and early childhood special education;
- teach in collaborative and inclusive settings as a general or special education teacher;
- teach 2 years in inclusive pre-k, inclusive kindergarten, early intervention programs, or preschool special education for each year of QUIERE funding.

# Why QUIERE?

There is a critical need to prepare highly qualified teachers to work with infants, toddlers, and young children with disabilities and their families. This need is especially acute for children with disabilities whose families are of immigrant backgrounds.

QUIERE seeks to more fully address the needs of young English language learners whose families have low incomes.

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QUIERE Scholars will have an understanding of emergent bilingualism and will be able to use their knowledge in conjunction with research-based approaches to early childhood special education to create quality universally inclusive early educational curricula and teaching practices.





#### **ENHANCING DUAL CERTIFICATION**

**QUIERE** emphasizes the importance of partnering with families and collaborating with other professionals.

**Quality inclusive and diverse field** placements in NYC are fully tied to coursework.

Diverse field-based experiences will be followed by mentoring as the scholars enter their first year of teaching.

QUIERE addresses these target areas:

- meeting the needs of young learners and low income families;
- meeting the needs of English language learners; and
- promoting early literacy for diverse learners.
