In this first issue of the semester, I'd like to bring your attention to the Provost's internal funding opportunities for faculty and student research and a grant writing coach. The next Collaboration Grants are due on March 25; the Diversity Grants, sponsored by the FEC Subcommittee on Race, Culture, and Diversity (RCD), are due on April 5, and the Provost's Dissertation Research Award for students is due on March 4. In addition, foundations such as the American Institutes for Research and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation are launching new funding opportunities regarding equity in education and health.

The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's <u>Health Policy Research Scholars</u> <u>Program</u> provides an annual stipend of \$30,000 for up to four years for doctoral students. **The deadline is March 7, 2024**. <u>TC students</u> have been recipients of this generous award in the recent past.

Also, please note that the redesigned RESEARCH@TC Website, managed by the Office of the Vice Dean for Research, has launched! It improves access to services and centralizes information from the offices at TC that support the research infrastructure at the College: Digital Futures Institute (DFI), Institutional Review Board (IRB), Office of Sponsored Projects (OSP), Office of Global Engagement (OGE), the Gottesman Libraries, and the Office of Grants & Contracts. The website also provides proposal preparation resources and tools to help TC's researchers prepare successful grant applications; VDR's new US-focused Grants Database, a new interactive database of funding opportunities, specially curated for TC researchers, and OGE's International Grants Database. Recent Faculty Awardees of External Grants

The Russell Sage Foundation announced its selection of 17 visiting scholars for the 2024-2025 academic year. Among them is **Ansley Erickson**. While in residence at RSF, the visiting scholars will pursue research and writing projects that reflect the foundation's commitment to strengthening the social sciences and conducting research for the improvement of social and living conditions in the United States.
